Published by Square Enix, SINOALICE is a mobile gotcha game, similar to Fire Emblem Heroes, with art and lots of beautiful to collect. It becomes an RPG, there are classes, weapons, armor, and items that can be equipped by any character, and some they can't if their class doesn't fit. The music is really top-notch. The haunting tone will remind you of NieR Automata (if you play it) and it's because of the same composer! Seriously, I just love sitting on the main menu and listening to the soundtrack. I really haven't done that yet hello original back in the days of OG Xbox. The battle is an intense sprint. I like to think of them as a test of time, where you have to think quickly. You can't pause to strategize, but you'll improve over time. Has good reflexes help too. Again, like Fire Emblem, there's a system of elemental weaknesses and weapons that you have to play with to experience. Each character is someone who is famous from fairy tales, such as Alice, Snow White, Little Red Riding Hood, and so on. The characters each have their own story that you advance, with the aim of reviving the author of each character's story. Of course, this becomes a free-to-play game published by Square Enix, there are a number of excessive micro-transactions for in-game currencies to get around. They are not as in your face as any other game on this list, but you have been warned. Oh, and there's a cross-over event of NieR Automata coming up and repliCant one coming up later this year. SINOALICE is a free RPG with beautiful art, interesting and thought-provoking stories, amazing music, and a fun fighting system. The only downside is micro-transactions. We don't often see staggered releases between Android and iOS these days, but Sky: Children of the Light took almost a year to arrive at the first. Good thing too, because this is a very fun game. It's worth installing if there's nothing else but enjoying a beautiful art style, a beautiful world, and a relaxing adventure. It's hard to describe Sky, but I'll try to be concise. After some time with the game, it is clear that the focus is on exploration and socializing. Your goal is to find the lost stars and guide them home to their constellations; In return, they teach you new things. There is no fighting on Sky, so anyone can feel free to jump and enjoy without stress. It's a very relaxing game with a lot to do for completion and a lot to see for casual gamers. Sky's biggest draw is its art style, world design and gameplay, all of which are stunning. Your character has a kind of winged robe that you use to fly, glide, and go where you can't jump simple. The set piece on display here is second to none on Android and evokes such awe that I almost forgot to take the screenshot. It has several different graphics options as well, but I chose to run it at 60fps to make sure what I saw moved as smoothly as possible. Overall, I would say the biggest mistake with Sky is that it's heavily taxing on your phone. My OnePlus 6 heats up like crazy and my Pixel 4 XL isn't much better. There are also micro transactions to buy Candles, which is a key item in the game. There is also an in-game currency called Hearts, which is how you buy cosmetics for your character. I've entered some already and I haven't spent a penny, so they don't need to or on your face anything. Sky is a gorgeous adventure created by Journey developers. Apart from some of the usual free-to-play traps, this is a very valuable experience. I had trouble choosing just one classic RPG for this list, as we had a few to choose from. In the end, I went with the Knights of the Old Republic, better known as DIRTY, for this list. First, Star Wars is a very popular franchise and I am this is a game worth playing if you enjoy that universe. Originally created by BioWare in its heyday, KOTOR is a fantastic story. Beyond that, I'm afraid I'm going to get into spoilers, so I'll leave it at that. DIRTY is considered one of the best RPGs of all time and I would be hard to disagree. Ported to Android thanks to the guys at Aspyr, KOTOR has a new life on the phone and although it may be a great price to get in, it's worth every penny. From story to battle, this and the sequel are definitely the best Star Wars games ever made. There is gamepad support, achievements, and a revamped UI designed specifically for touchscreens. This is an excellent port and I haven't found any bugs in the years I've played this. If you like Star Wars, do yourself a favor and check out DIRTY. A classic RPG considered one of the best of all time, KOTOR is a great game redesigned for smartphones. Very decent at the asking price to get a fantastic story and excellent gameplay. And then there were two. Coming as a surprise from the people in Aspyr is Star Wars: Knights of the Old Republic II. This is my personal favorite Star Wars game of all time and one of my favorite RPGs ever. It's an amazing game with a lot of depth, incredible storytelling, and great old-fashioned Star Wars action. This game has been around for a long time and looks, but trust me, the number of hours you will pour into this game will make you forget about the date graphics. It's a slow start as you get used to how the game functions and you won't get your first lightsaber anytime soon, but there are still plenty of weapons (plus Force powers) to use against your enemies. You can follow Light or Darkness, or try to straddle both, and your decision has long-lasting consequences. All told, this game is not only classic, but also a good Android port. It maintains the look of the PC version, but feels better optimized for mobile. There are also graphic settings. \$15 is pretty steep for a mobile game, but if you like Star Wars, it's a must play. The best Star Wars game ever ended up on Android with mobile-optimized controls, settings, and menus. Re-live the story of Jedi Exile in a glorious game on the go. It's a masterpiece. Titan Quest originally came out back in 2006 and helped fill the long void left by Diablo II before III came out. It's an isometric ARPG with lots of loot, monsters to kill, and beautiful sights to see. And while there is still a community around it on PC thanks to THQ Nordic Titan Quest Anniversary Edition, users can experience the jewels of this game belongs to the port from a few years ago. For starters, this is not a Birthday Edition port and therefore does not have all the new content (extra specialization and expansion) and improved quality of life. Secondly, no controller support and touch controls can feel a little strange at points. However, it is a mostly nice port of one of my favorite games of all time and it definitely deserves a place on this list. This classic ARPG was ported to Android a few years ago and is worth every penny. If you like ancient mythology, hack-and-slash ARPG gameplay, and lots of loot, this game is definitely one you should take. Sometimes, your opinion just doesn't line up with others and that's fine sometimes. Similarly here with the V4, my game I really enjoyed, but had a lot of angry 1 star reviews on the Play Store at the time of writing. I have thrown almost 10 hours into this game at the moment and I disagree with a lot of the indipatience as most of it seems to be due to technical launch issues, such as server issues and character creation. Published by Nexon, I was on guard and somewhat suspiciously got into the V4. I was finally surprised. V4 is a dark fantasy MMO that has beautiful art, nice graphics, a decent character creator, 6 classes to choose from, and your choice between auto-play (a la idle clickers) or manual play, like a traditional MMO. However, the voice acting and dialogue were both quite horrifying and I didn't enjoy most of the sound effects. My double pistol and Gunslinger rifle should boom, not sound like they slap the enemy, for example. Otherwise, it's your typical MMO rate. You have character levels that define statistics, levels for additional statistics that can sacrifice your teeth to improve, and various daily missions and achievements to complete. There are various mounts for you to show off and a variety of pets that offer additional bonuses, such as xp boost. I wouldn't say the V4 is as innovative as an MMO, but to be mobile and free-to-play, I quite like it. With just launched, some dental problems are expected. Some players have reported (through 1-star reviews) login issues, full servers, and problems making character creators spin. In playtime I've never had a single problem. Apart from the name implying a sci-fi setting, V4 is actually a dark fantasy MMO. Despite the launch issues, the V4 has 6 classes to choose from, a beautiful world to explore, and plenty of MMO milling to do. Fan Fans from Darknss IP Vampire: The Masquerade has a lot to be excited about. While we patiently wait for Bloodlines 2, we have something to plug us up. Called Night Road, this game is a 100% text-based RPG where your choices matter. It also helps that the writing is amazing and the game itself is huge on 650,000 words (give or take).

On Night Road, you play as a vampire courier driving through the American Southwest delivering goods and messages to higher vampires. Not only are vampire hunters after you, but you have to keep up with the dawn as you make your way to your destination. However, in the end, you define the character to your liking. Considering the size of the game and the many options you can make, Night Road is an excellent text-based adventure and a fun one to play several times to see how different options affect the narrative. You can start playing for free, but at some point, you have to find more than \$10 to finish the game. You can also pay \$1 to remove an ad. Survive the rising sun and vampire hunters who are persistent in retrieving text-based RPGs. This game sports a lot of excellent writing, and meaningful choices that affect the game. Wayward Souls has been around for a while, but boys are a great game. It's like being naughty with an ARPG element, or an ARPG with a naughty-like element. Both are equally valid, I think, although I tend to fall in the former camp. However, what really matters is that Wayward Souls is an amazing game and absolutely must for fans of naughty likes and/or ARPGs. You find yourself in a strange tower and you are given a choice: do you play as a witch, a rogue, or a warrior? The goal is to reach the exit of each level, but it can often be very difficult or very easy, depending on your luck from the draw and your skills. Each level is procedurally generated, so your enemy's loot, layout, and placement will be different each time. The game is very difficult, don't get me wrong, but I think the difficulty is done pretty well. You don't have to deal with finicky touchscreen controls - quite the opposite, really - and the game teaches you the Basics. Due to the procedural generation, there may not be a sharp enough increase in challenges, but you will be fine. This game is amazing. From beautiful art styles to challenging gameplay, Wayward Souls is as difficult as naughty/APRG that will push the boundaries of your skills. From first-person immersion to third-person top-downs, these games are filled with action and bullets. What else do I have to say? Call of Duty Mobile There was a lot of hype surrounding Call of Duty Mobile throughout the beta and ahead of its global launch, and to the credit Activision and TiMi Studios (a subsidiary of Tencent Games) the game was phenomenal and was voted one of the best mobile games in 2019 - and it just keeps on for the better in 2020. In the latest update, it now offers an incredible new 20 vs. 20 Battle Royale mode called Warfare. A big reason why the game plays so well can be credited to Tencent Games. It has a mobile shooter space with PUBG Mobile, another game featured in this list, and fans of that game will recognize the familiar user interface and surprising gameplay performance that has been perfectly optimized for mobile. CoD Mobile takes advantage of many of the iconic multiplayer maps from the Call of Duty franchise and really does a great job translating the fast action that makes this game a lot of fun to play on other platforms. Call of Duty Mobile features a core team deathmatch mode known as Call of Duty along with a Battle Royale mode introduced in the main franchise with CoD: Black Ops 4. They could easily just get stuck with the team's deathmatch and still have a great game on their hands, but the inclusion of a 100-player battle royale (along with fan-favorite zombie mode) only adds more value to the total package. I have been playing CoD Mobile since the beta and it has become one of my games every time I have a few minutes to kill. Because the game is so popular, it's very fast to jump into matches, whether you want to play casually or against more veteran players in ranked matches. Since this is a free game to play, there are common pitfalls including in-app purchases to buy in-game currency, which can then be spent on battle chests filled with random rewards, and tiered progress paths with premium subscriptions available to capture more rewards. Considering the console or PC version of Call of Duty will set you back at least \$60 upfront, along with all the eventual paid DLC and inevitable micro-transactions for cosmetic enhancements, the mobile version finally feels superior in terms of value upfront. You don't need to take out your credit card to really enjoy this game - which is a big reason why Call of Duty Mobile demands a top spot on our list. Call of Duty has won the Game of the Year award for 2019 for good reason. This is a very complete version of Call of Duty for mobile phones that is completely free to play. True, it is the granddaddy of a first-person shooter and awesome and just as powerful as a powerful sequel. Both of these games more than deserve a place on this list not only for their satiety, but because the Android ports are really pretty good. Bethesda has fixed many of the initial problems, including removing Bethesda.net account requirements and changing touch screen controls, and now I can sincerely recommend both games. Still recommend using a controller if you can, however. Doom is almost 30 years old and boy, it survives the test of time. Like other 90s classics, Doom and Doom II were true passion projects, games that pushed the tech envelope at the time. Although not technically impressive today - Doom Doom runs on pregnancy tests - they retain their almost perfect charm, character, and gameplay. Top all this with updates that bring support for resolutions of 16:9 and 90-120 frames per second and you get yourself a very smooth duology shooter. Although everyone else in this section encourages what's possible on mobile today, Doom and Doom II just chuck along, providing exhilarating nostalgia for those of us who played it in our younger years or giving younger gamers the chance to experience the history of video games. No need to introduce, one of the most popular games in the world is available on the Play Store. Love it or hate it, Fortnite is now easier for everyone to jump on their phone without having to activate a third-party installation. So even though you've been able to play Fortnite on Android for over a year, we think it belongs here on this list now more than ever.
